When and where

Presentations of your projects will take place on Wednesday, March 11. We'll start at 5pm in [ALP 1600](#) and continue at 6:30pm in our default location, [ICS 174](#).

Each presentation will be 10 minutes long. Teams will be ordered randomly, then split into 4 sessions of 7 presentations. Attending your entire session is mandatory, and you're welcome to attend other sessions as well, but please don't come or go during a presentation.

Please send us a private message on the forum **by the end of the week** if you cannot make your assigned time, and we'll do our best to accommodate.

Content

I'm keeping these guidelines short because what and how you present greatly depends on your specific project and what you find interesting to share. Having said that, your presentation should roughly follow the same structure as the [project report](#). Please make sure to clearly state the problem(s) you were trying to solve, the motivation for it, the solution(s) you tried, the results you got, and the insight you gained. It's generally good to include plots and (when applicable) short videos in your slides. Much can be said in 10 minutes if you prepare well.

For grading, we tend to look for 5 aspects of a presentation:

1. Motivation
2. Problem statement
3. Approach / method
4. Results
5. Discussion / insight

A good and easy approximation of our more nuanced evaluation process is to think of each of these aspects as worth 3 of the 15 grade points given for the presentation.

Logistics

To smoothen the process, please upload your slides to [this deck](#) after your team's title slide. Please keep the title slides in order, as a cue for the next team to come up to present.

If you use Google Slides, just copy your slides to the deck. If you use Powerpoint, you can upload your slides to Google Drive, open in Slides, and then copy them. If you use Keynote, you can export to Powerpoint and continue from there. If you use another format and have issues converting to Slides, please let us know as soon as possible.
